A KOLBE Catholic College Year 11 TEE student has wowed judges at the Worldskills Australia Vocational Education and Training in Schools competition in the Information Technology category.

Nathan Wood, 16, said he and the other State competitors were asked to create a series of logos and letterheads for a company.

Though graphic design comes a definite second place to the Warnbro computer whiz's number one passion — software development — he said the need to develop graphics for his programs meant he was familiar with the programs needed to get the job done.

“It was really good,” he said.

After winning the State competition, Nathan will now represent WA in the national Worldskills finals, to be held in Brisbane next year.
